Mark Bussow joined the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) in June of 2004. He currently supports the Deputy Associate Director for Management as the chief analyst for performance management and general management policy. In this position he serves as the interim lead on Transparency Act implementation and USASpending.gov. He also led development of the Recovery Act transparency reporting model and the initial launch of Recovery.gov.

Prior to this position Mr. Bussow was the Special Assistant to the Director of OMB. In this position he played a leadership role in preparing OMB for the Presidential transition, and on a variety of special projects for the Director. Mr. Bussow also served as a Policy Analyst in OMB's Office of Federal Financial Management, as the lead on the Improved Financial Performance President's Management Agenda (PMA) scorecard. He first joined OMB as a Program Examiner in OMB's International Affairs Division, with budget and oversight responsibility for the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), focusing on USAID management, operations, and development assistance.

Prior to joining OMB Mr. Bussow was the Finance Officer for Technology Investment Banking at JPMorganChase, and served on the legislative staff of a United States Senator.

Mr. Bussow holds a Baccalaureate degree in Philosophy from the University of Kansas, and a Master of Business Administration in Public Management from Yale University.
